1.Introduction

Sahmakum Teang Tnaut Organisation is a Cambodian Urban NGO with a vision of urban poor and vulnerable communities receiving adequate housing, and improved living conditions and prosperity. Its mission is to develop advocacy tools, empower, and support urban poor and vulnerable communities to obtain adequate and comfortable housing.

STT was founded in 2005 and officially registered in 2006 as a local NGO supporting urban poor communities providing technical inputs, mainly community mapping and reliable data/information from research studies to affected communities so that they can use them as advocacy tools to claim their housing rights. Currently, STT is running five main projects, which consist of 1. Mapping and Urban Initiative Project; 2. Community Empowerment and networking Project; 3. Community Media and ICT Project; 4. Land and Housing Rights project and 5. Community Action Research project.

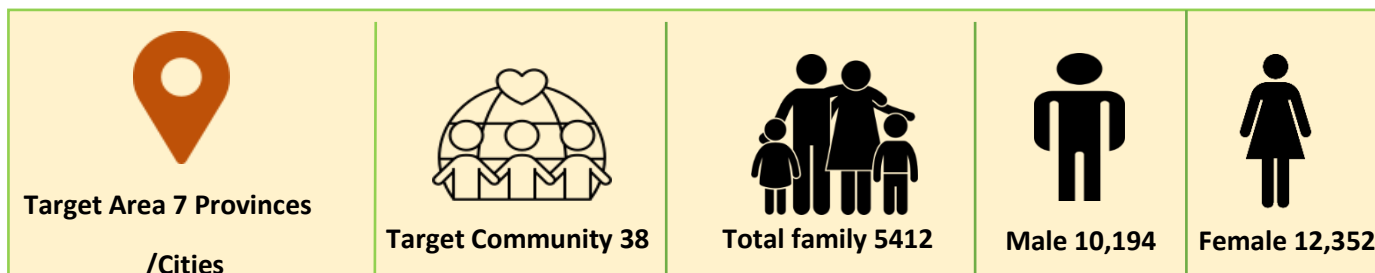
STT's Target Area



2. STT's Program

To achieve its vision and mission, **Sahmakum Teang Tnaut Organizaton** has been working on five projects: 1. Urban mapping and initiative project, 2. Community empowerment and networking project, 3. ICT and media for the community project, 4. Land and housing rights project, and 5. Community Action Research project.

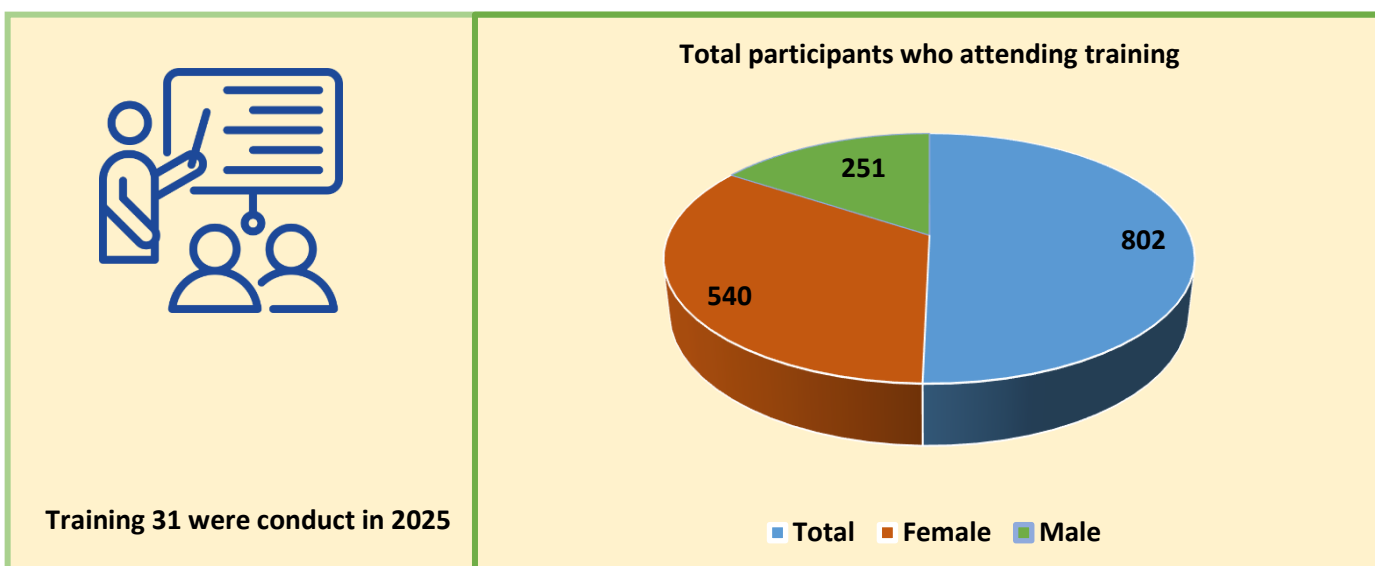
In 2025, the STT's has worked with 38 target communities in seven provinces, comprising 5412 families, 12,352 women, and 10,194 men.



2.1 Capacity Building

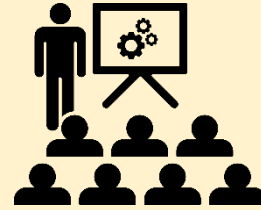
Sahmakum Teang Tnaut Organizaton has taken strengthening the capacity of the target group as a necessary factor and an important means to make the target group have ownership and independence in decision-making by providing trainings to strengthen the capacity of the target community. This capacity-building is conducted in three forms: 1) training, 2) exchange visit, and 3) quarterly meetings covering key topics such as the right to adequate housing, land law, expropriation law, community leadership, conflict resolution, advocacy, and digital security.

In 2025, the STT has provided (1) 31 training sessions with 802 participants, 540 women and 251 men from 38 target communities, which are the target groups for 2025.

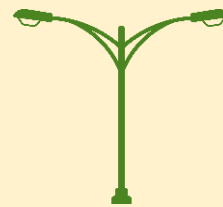

In 2025, the STT's organized (2) 9 exchange visits to target communities with 303 participants, including 116 women and 187 men. Additionally, six quarterly meetings were held in both Phnom Penh and provinces, with a total of 213 participants, including 143 women and 70 men.

2.2 Small Scale Upgrading

Sahmakum Teang Tnaut Organizaton consistently provides small-scale improvement assistance to target groups based on necessity and practical needs, according to its capabilities. In 2025, the STT's has provided 27 housing improvements and 10 streetlights. The Tomnup Ta Thlang Community received 18 houses, the Andong Ta leng Community received 9 houses, and the Boeung Trabek Community in phum 4 and 5 received 10 streetlights. This provision aligns with the needs and necessities of the community to contribute to improving community livelihoods in line with climate change and to improve the community's living conditions.

2.3 Advocacy and Campaign

Sahmakum Teang Tnaut Organizaton has also co-organized national and sub-national forums with partner organizations, communities, and local authorities. In 2025, STT organized and co-organized six national forums with a total of 765 participants: 358 women and 407 men, covering related topics such as Human Rights Day, Housing Rights Day, and Environment Day.

In addition, the Sahmakum Teang Tnaut Organizaton has partnered with partner organizations and local communities to organize 16 forums, campaigns, and other events, with a total of 3,602 participants, including 2,250 women and 1,352 men, on the topics of human rights, climate change, and land issues.

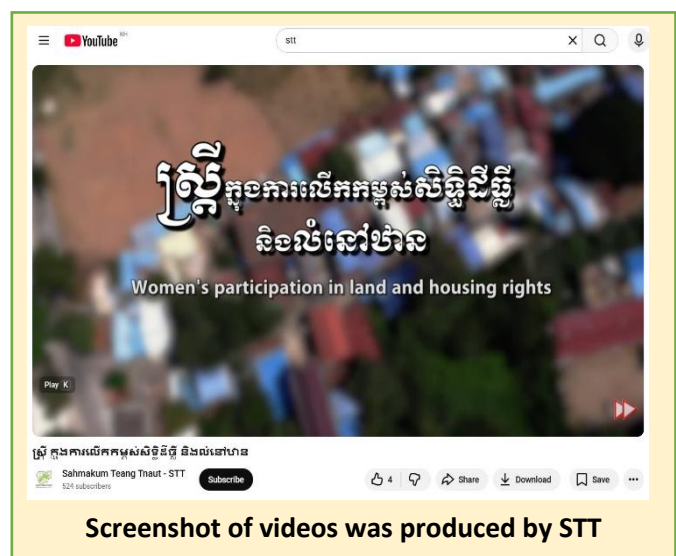
2.4 Research and Publication

Sahmakum Teang Tnuat organization annually produces research reports on urban development, governance, and land rights issues. In 2025, it published 2 reports and 3 short research articles. Additionally, STT also produced 2 maps for communities to use.



2.5 Media

The Sahmakum Teang Tnuat has produced videos related to human rights and land rights issues concerning its target groups. In 2025, STT produced 28 different videos related to land rights and human rights issues occurring in target areas.



2.6 Youth Engagement

Recognizing the importance of youth participation in problem-solving and as successors, *The Sahmakum Teang Tnuat* has developed several activities to connect youth with urban communities. The aim is to enhance youth awareness, provide opportunities for youth to contribute and provide feedback on urban development and organization. This allows youth to exercise their rights and raise concerns and concerns about urban design, public transportation, waste management, infrastructure, traffic, and environmental issues, among others, through campaigns, public awareness raising, capacity development, and various activities on both digital platforms and workshops.

In 2025, *The Sahmakum Teang Tnuat* will coordinate and provide (1) training courses, (2) youth camps, (3) meetings, (4) youth advocacy campaigns, (5) Exchange visit, (6) debates, and (7) annual youth conferences.
